Through positive engagement with patients, their family members and other care providers, the incumbent gathers information, develops treatment plans, identifies strengths and vulnerabilities, and coordinates and monitors services accordingly. Serving as a consistent and trusted educator, the incumbent helps to ensure the community and individuals are knowledgeable and prepared to execute healthy choices.

The incumbent is an integral part of the community in which he/she serves; commitment and dedication to continuity and quality of care is imperative for success. Successful candidates will have proven understanding of the impact of family dynamics, cultural influences, psychosocial issues, and/or substance abuse issues on the health and well-being of the patient; he/she will know how to best develop strategies for the maximum benefit of the patient. Candidate should have experience with trauma informed care and treating co-occurring disorders.
