The **Behavioral Health & Wellness Manager** provides two distinct roles in the provision of Behavioral Health & Wellness services in support of regional community members - one administrative and the other direct-care service provision. In other words, the best of both worlds! The incumbent will provide oversight of a developing regional behavioral health team, comprised of Behavioral Health Aides, as well as contracted clinical staff providing tele-behavioral health services. This position needs someone with a desire to lead others, a zest for developing program, an eye for growth and change, and a passion for promoting mental health awareness. It's also a position which requires provision of therapeutic treatment and clinical preventative services in an individual or group setting.

Serving as a consistent and trusted educator, the incumbent helps to ensure the community and individuals are knowledgeable and prepared to execute healthy choices. He/she must demonstrate a commitment and dedication to continuity and quality of care. Successful candidates will have proven success in program development, awareness and/or familiarity with Tribal Health Organizations, and proven ability to support families through behavioral health initiatives. Candidates should have experience with trauma informed care and treating co-occurring disorders. Likewise, innovative and creative problem solving, collaboration and patience, and determination are competencies that help define the ideal Behavioral Health & Wellness Manager.

This is a **full-time position** primarily located in **Anchorage**, but requires travel to sites served by Eastern Aleutian Tribes in the region.

To compete for this position, candidates must possess:

- Master of social work, psychology, counseling, or related field
- Licensure in the State of Alaska as a Psychologist, LCSW, LPC, LMFT, NP, PA
- Two (2) years of post-graduate supervisory experience, preferably in a community or rural health center is required; four (4) years is preferred.
- A valid AK Driver's License (insurable by EAT)
- Experience in rural cross culture setting is preferred.
